Completion of Course

The course is composed of 9 modules. At the end of each module, learners must take the quiz and achieve a score of 4 out of 5 to pass the quiz and proceed to the next module. The course is completed once all modules are covered and all quizzes are passed.

Course Overview

End-of-Life Nursing Education Consortium (ELNEC) Pediatric Curriculum is an online training course designed for nurses and allied health professionals on pediatric palliative care. Common themes integrated throughout the course include the significant influence of culture on palliative care, the importance of incorporating psychosocial care in palliative care, and the interdisciplinary nature of palliative care.

Objectives

The course aims to enhance nursing and health professionals' knowledge and skills in pediatric palliative care.

Target Enrollees

The course is targeted for nurses and allied health professionals (e.g. social workers, child life specialists) who would like to be equipped on pediatric palliative and end-of-life care.

Duration

Learners may complete the modules at their own pace within a maximum span of four (4) weeks.
